Quality Jobs Tax Credit

The Quality Jobs Tax Credit offers up to \$9,000 of Arizona income or premium tax credits spread over a three-year period for each net new quality job.

City of Mesa

Mesa Foreign Trade Zone #211

Qualified businesses located in the Mesa Foreign Trade Zone or sub-zone may reduce or defer tariffs and duties, and are eligible for up to an 80% reduction in state real and personal property taxes. The Mesa FTZ is located at the Phoenix-Mesa Gateway Airport. An FTZ Subzone can be designated in another Mesa location when a company is unable to operate effectively at the existing zone site.

Private Activity Bonds

Private Activity Bonds are securities issued by or on behalf of a local government to provide debt financing for projects used for the trade or business of a private user.

Government Property Lease Excise Tax (GPLET)

GPLET is a redevelopment tool used to initiate development by reducing a project's operating costs by replacing the real property tax with an excise tax.
